



## What To Bring: Citizenship & Marriage

- If the name on your green card is different than your current legal name: Do you have the documents that legally changed your name? (<u>examples</u>: Marriage certificate, divorce decree, or court document)
- If you are applying for U.S. citizenship based on marriage to a U.S. Citizen, do you have:
  - ✓ Proof your spouse has been a citizen for the past three (3) years (<u>examples</u>: spouse's birth certificate, naturalization certificate, certificate of citizenship, U.S. Passport, or Form FS240)
  - ✓ Current marriage certificate
  - ✓ If your current spouse was married before, proof that all prior marriages have been terminated (divorce decrees, annulments, or death certificates)
  - ✓ Documents showing that you and your spouse are still living together (<u>examples</u>: tax returns, bank statements, leases, mortgages, birth certificates for your children, IRS tax return transcript for the last three (3) years )
- If you have been married more than one time, do you have:
  - ✓ Proof that all prior marriages have been terminated (divorce decrees, annulments, or death certificates)
- If you have a dependent spouse or children who do NOT live with you, do you have:
  - ✓ Any court order to provide financial support AND
  - ✓ Evidence of your financial support
    (<u>examples</u>: cancelled checks, money order receipts, evidence of wage
    garnishments, or a letter from a parent or guardian who cares for your children )
